The Company has a zero-tolerance approach to slavery and is committed to preventing acts of slavery and human trafficking from occurring within both its business and supply chain, and imposes those same high standards on its contractors, suppliers and other business partners.

Company structure

The Company is a UK domicile company, a wholly owned subsidiary of The Seventeen Group Limited and does not outsource any products or services.

We work with a select panel of UK Insurance suppliers and carefully chosen external suppliers for office infrastructure support.

Due diligence processes

We:

- Ensure that suppliers comply with all applicable laws and standards, including those which relate to the Modern Slavery Act.
- Expect our suppliers to have suitable anti-slavery and human trafficking policies and processes in place within their own businesses and to cascade those policies to their own suppliers.
- Encourage staff to identify and report any potential breaches of Touchstones anti-slavery policy statement.
- Whistle blowers are protected through our confidential reporting process.

The above reporting procedures are designed to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our business and supply chains.
- Reduce the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our business and supply chains.
- Provide adequate protection for whistle blowers.
